



Unnamed female presenter: But 1st today, we're going to take a look at the future and the people who say that *they* can look into it: palmists, clairvoyants and fortune tellers. Janice Dickinson is here with me in the studio and she's been doing some investigating. Janice, what sort of people want to have their futures foretold?

Janice Dickinson: Well, all sorts of people – and I think most of us are fascinated by it, whether we take it seriously or not. And people who go regularly to clairvoyants and palmists do take it very seriously indeed and believe it absolutely implicitly. Take this lady for instance.

First female interviewee (prerecorded interview): Well, you know, I went with an open mind and when I was told what I was told it was quite shattering... 'cause it's unbelievable that someone can know the only things that *you* know, and er, I just couldn't believe what he told me! He was able to tell me things that only I know as a person. For instance, I have lived with a man for 12 years, he told me that I'd had 2 men in my life, which is quite correct – only 2. And the one I'm with now, I'm living with. At the moment, I'm going through a divorce and he said everything would be alright by February. He also, before this, he'd also told my sister, I hadn't seen her for 20 years but he... she, apparently she had been to him and he said that she would get my address given to her, which happened. And through that address being given to her, I met her after 20 years, she didn't know where I was, what happened to me or anything. But it's proved true! You know you can only say of what you hear and what you see, you can't... people say they just... um, they pretend these people, but if they tell you something that only you know you've got to believe them, haven't you?

Unnamed female presenter: Well, that clairvoyant certainly seemed very accurate, but how do they claim it's done?

Janice Dickinson: Well, they all have different methods, but I went to see one lady in Birmingham, Mme Constantia, and she really does the lot!

Second female interviewee (prerecorded interview): All of it started, really, in a game. I picked up the tea cup and read the tea leaves, for various... young [?] people around me and they said: "Oh do that again, everything you said came true!" So I suppose it was the Lord telling me then to use my gifts. Then afterwards... um, I started to... um, read tea cups, and then I worked at the cards, and the crystal ball.
